

Don taught mathematics at the University of Wisconsin-Superior for over 25 years while he and Gayle raised their 6 children on their Maple, Wisconsin farm. In 1990, Don and Gayle set off on their 'grand adventure' and moved to the United Arab Emirates where Don taught at the UAE University in Al Ain for 6 years.

After Don's retirement from teaching, they based themselves in Superior, Wisconsin but spent much of their time traveling around the country, visiting friends and family. Don especially enjoyed fishing from his little rowboat on Lake Minnesuing in Wisconsin and hiking and exploring the desert around Ajo, Arizona, where they eventually settled. In Ajo, Don and Gayle spent their time creating their beautiful Loma Bonita, serving with the Ajo Samaritans, volunteering at the Ajo Historical Museum and St Vincent Thrift Store, and providing a warm welcome to all who walked through their door.
