During all four years of high school, Ella was active in volleyball, softball, trap-shooting/ Community Ed Team, Science Olympiad, student council and served as class president.


Ella worked on the Boyceville High School yearbook during her senior year.



"My team was like a second family to me, and I am going to miss playing sports in the future," she said.


Harper's summer plans include work, family and a mission trip. "For the summer, I plan

money for my first year of college," she said. Bella will attend UW-La Crosse this


fall. "I chose to pursue a biology major so I can eventually work towards my goal of becoming a veterinarian," she said.
