Daily Globe Congratulates Contest Winners

The Daily Globe celebrates its Newspaper in Education program each March and today newspaper officials announce the results of its seventh annual student writing and advertising design contest.

Each year it's a big project mustered by K-12 teachers and students across the region, as well as Daily Globe advertising staff. With COVID-19 taking a bight out of face-to-face education in many local schools for weeks at a time, the project became more difficult, but the wheels kept moving, the mission persisted.

"I appreciate all the work that was put into this section this year," said Daily Globe Advertising Director Heidi Ofstad. "I know with school being called off for illness and weather, it makes this more challenging for the teachers but they always come through with wonderful essays and drawings."

Last fall, the Daily Globe invited area schools to participate in a number of classroom activities centered around literacy and the newspaper — reading, writing and drawing up an advertisement for a local business.

The Daily Globe presented a series of

writing and advertising assignments for students in elementary, middle and high school.

Classes worked at their own pace and entries were due to the Daily Globe earlier this year.

The writing contest was offered to students in elementary and middle school. Each grade level had a different assignment. Some of the assignments also asked the student to draw an illustration to accompany their writing.

Assignments in the younger grades asked students to write about their favorite book, character or place to read; while the writing tasks for older students asked them to share an opinion on a certain subject and explain why they held that belief.

The teachers acted as preliminary judges, forwarding the best from their class to the newspaper. Daily Globe staff judged the finalists and the results of each grade level are on the pages of this special section.

The "Design an Ad" portion of the contest asked students in grades 4-12 to design an advertisement for a local business. Participating classrooms were presented with a short list of Daily Globe advertisers and each student either chose or was assigned an advertiser for whom to create an ad.

The student-designed ads were collected and presented by the Daily Globe's sales representatives to the particular advertisers, who chose which ad best captured their advertising message, thus deciding the winner for each advertising account. Those ads are also in this special section.

The Daily Globe approached officials from all schools in the three-county area. The newspaper received 353 Design an Ad entries and 88 writing entries from eight schools.

The section remains popular with students, educators, readers and advertisers, and has won critical acclaim, as well, including numerous awards in the most recent Wisconsin Newspaper Association's Better Newspaper Contest.

"Congratulations to all the winners," said Daily Globe publisher Sue Mizell. "There were many fine entries. Thank you to all the students who participated and to the teachers who helped with the contest. Also, thank you to the advertisers for supporting this contest."

Ofstad thanked the school staff members who acted as liaisons, including Carol Kariainen, Ironwood; Sarah Eder and Angie Eitrem, Hurley; Rachael Hendges, Bessemer; Candace Jacobs and Connor Drier, Wakefield-Marenisco; Nina Fiorucci, Ewen-Trout Creek; Elizabeth Guilbault, Ontonagon; Natalie Allen, Mercer; and Merrie Beth Hellman, Bluff View Christian School.


"Without the dedication of these liaisons, this section would not be possible," Ofstad said.


