Fathers who 'never had a professional picture' have their love captured on camera

RACINE — Deontrae Mayfield often posts photos with his 9-month-old daughter on Facebook. One day, he asked other fathers to do the same: post pictures with their kids. But the results were not quite what he was expecting.

He was seeing a lot of selfies, and many outdated photos. Nothing really new or high-quality.

"I was like, wow. A lot of guys probably never had a professional picture," Mayfield said. "I wanted to bridge a visual gap by photography.

I wanted them to have something they can hang on their wall and be proud of."

Megan Powell works as an X-ray technician at Ascension All Saints Hospital, but is a professional photographer on the side, focusing on family and maternity photography.

Mayfield and Megan began collaborating on a "Daddy and Kids" photoshoot, a project focused on highlighting black men as fathers.

"I was all in, 100%, right away," said Megan Powell, whose husband is Racine Police Department Lt. Walter Powell. "I was like, 'yes absolutely!' Deontrae is a mile a minute with his great ideas."

"It was amazing," Mayfield said. "It worked out super, super well."

# 'You have to help us here'

Why the city holds bars responsible for unruly patrons' behavior even after they leave

RACINE — If two patrons of a cupcake shop left the store and began fighting down the street, there would probably be no consequences for the shop's owner.

The same is not true for the city's bar owners/operators.

The city's nuisance ordinance makes the per-

son who holds the license for the bar answerable for whatever their patrons might do within 200 feet of the premises — the length from end to end of an NHL hockey rink — even if the business has closed for the night and the incident occurred on public property.

The nature of the business means bar owners have issues very different than other business owners.

## Responsibilities

The question of a bar owner's responsibility was raised by Yolanda "Yogi" Blair, whose husband, Terrance, was shot and killed outside Mr. Kool Sports Bar, 1330 Washington Avenue, in the city's Uptown neighborhood on May 15.

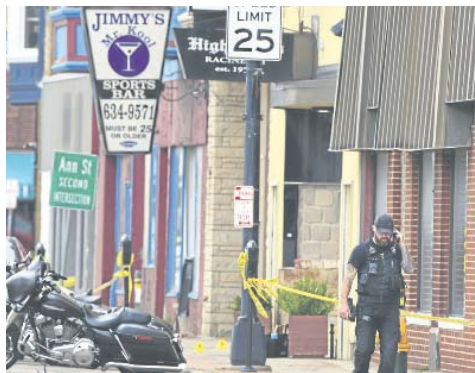
Mr. Kool had just reopened on May 13, under new ownership, after the bar's previous owner died

in 2020.

The new owners were Tom and Donna Paschen. Yogi was listed on city paperwork as the site manager while Terrance was also a manager.

Blair told The Journal Times that events began on May 15 at around 2:35 a.m. — after Mr. Kool had closed and staff was cleaning up
