

The Brookwood Falcons and the Cashton Eagles have each won their first two games of the 2021 season. They now will meet in a rivalry game that features major stakes in deciding playoff bids and the race for the Scenic Bluffs title.

The two teams will take the field in what will be both of their conference openers Friday, September 3 at 7 p.m. in Ontario.


Cashton (2-0) is off to just the start it was hoping for coming off a highly successful spring campaign.

The Eagles went 6-1 during the spring alternate season and only a last-minute 34-28 loss to Bangor kept them from a conference title. Though they weren't able to enjoy a playoff berth then, they did make the postseason in 2019 for the first time since 2015.

Cashton opened the season by snapping a seven-game losing streak to rival Ithaca with a 19-14 win and then followed it up by walloping Hillsboro 53-8 last Saturday.

Junior Colin O'Neil is setting the pace out of the backfield for the Eagles with 247 yards and three touchdowns on 33 carries, while sophomore Bret Hemmersbach has piled up 104 yards and a touchdown on only 12 rushes.

Brookwood (2-0) went 3-4 back in the spring, but had made the playoffs in the five years prior. That spring record did include a pair of close
