Brewers' Braun to retire

Field Level Media Six-time All-Star outfielder Ryan Braun announced his retirement Tuesday, Sept. 14.

Braun, 37, played his entire 14-year career with the Milwaukee Brewers (2007-20). He was the National League Rookie of the Year in 2007 and the league's Most Valuable Player in 2011.

The Brewers posted a video message from Braun on Twitter.

"Today, more than 14 years after I first took the field as a Milwaukee Brewer, I've decided to retire," he said. "While it's impossible to summarize my emotions, what I feel most is one, simple thing — gratitude. I just wanted to take a moment to say 'thank you.'"

Braun batted .296/.358/.532 with a franchise-record 352 home runs, 1,154 RBIs and 216 stolen bases in 1,766 games.

He led the National League with 203 hits in 2009 and with 41 homers and 108 runs scored in 2012.

In July 2013, Braun was suspended without pay for the remainder of

The Spartan freshman jumped out to an early lead and won the race in 20 minutes, 18.9 seconds, nearly 23 seconds ahead of second-place Adeline Bauer of Ashland.

"When I started I was just going to stay with the girl that was up front and try to kick to the finish," McMeekin said. "But then it was just not my speed so I went ahead of her and then I just kept the pace I was comfortable with.'

McMeekin said she just started running last year at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic and came out for cross-country this fall. She ran her first race in Ashland a few weeks ago and finished second overall.

McMeekin set a new personal best of 19:58.2 and finished eighth overall at


