Freshman Abby Jones added 4 points on the night and freshman Emily Kirkman had 2.

and 1 assist, followed by sophomore Teryn Close, with 3 points, 3 rebounds and 1 assist.


Senior Teaira Spaeth and sophomore Grace Harycki each had 6 points, while Harycki finished with 2 rebounds and 2 assists
