A two-part eligibility application can be found in the Oct 6 News-Review. It must be filled out, dated and initialed before turning it in. The form will run for the next three Wednesdays in the North Woods Trader.

Applications also are available at the News-Review's front office.

#### Local generosity

The program would not be possible without the generosity of full-time and seasonal area residents, as well as clubs and organizations.

Fundraising efforts for the 2021 season have officially begun and the goal this year is \$80,000.


