Street outreach: Bridging the gap

The harsh reality of homelessness in Green Bay

"All you can do is go back and have that conversation again, and keep trying."

A fter spending much of the evening in the emergency room

addressing possible frostbite on several of his toes, a homeless individual in his late 50s spent the night, Jan. 16, tightly wrapped in a sleeping bag on the concrete floor under the St. John's Park pavilion in downtown Green Bay.

Next to nothing separated him from the elements.

Temperatures overnight – Sunday, Jan. 16, into Monday, Jan. 17 – dropped into the midteens, with wind chills dipping into the single digits.

Newcap's Homeless Outreach Team (HOT) was able to get this individual off the streets and into a motel for a couple of days. However, it's only a temporary solution.

The harsh reality is while many sleep comfortably in their heated homes, dozens of individuals sleep on the streets or in cars in the dead of Wisconsin winters.

It's the people behind the scenes – the boots on

the ground – that continue to tackle these issues head-on, which is quite honestly, no small feat.
