Sharla's Coffee Shop expands despite entrepreneurial challenges

Opening a small-town coffee shop at the beginning of a pandemic would daunt the heartiest of entrepreneurs. But the crisis hasn't stopped Dave and Sharla Walker.

On June 20, 2020, they opened Sharla's Coffee Shop inside the former Milton College Whitford Memorial Hall Library at 525 College St. in Milton. ## Mural connects West to schools all over the world

Milton West Elementary School is participating in a traveling mural project that helps connect Milton schools with others.

The art mural is one of 15 from the U.S., China and Canada that will be shared with 120 schools around the world.

This year's theme is the book, "The World Needs Who You Were Made To Be," by Joanna Gaines. Nording presented this idea to the art, music and physical education classes at Milton West to see whether they were
