Cantering Cafe aims to bring people together over pancakes

When Down Home Cookhouse closed abruptly in Brooklyn last summer after only two and a half years in business, it left a hole in a village that is growing, but doesn't have many places to sit down for a meal.

But after six months of work, a new restaurant has moved into the 233 Douglas Drive space.

Cantering Cafe opened on Feb. 7 and will offer Starbucks drinks and homemade breakfast foods from 6:30-11 a.m., Mondays through Fridays.

Brooklyn residents Hilari Rottier and Ben Cowan are the business partners – and partners in life – behind the new cafe.

For Oregon area hockey parents and players, Cowan is a familiar face. He graduated from Oregon High School in 2000 and is the president of the Oregon Ice Arena and vice president of the Oregon Tradesmen.

Sheboygan native Rottier has been a massage therapist for nearly a decade – serving the Janesville area until January, when she moved her services to

Brooklyn. She also works for the Ice Arena doing public relations and mar-

While the pair bonded over their shared love of the ice, it was a summer vacation out west that inspired their new business venture.

Rottier, her three boys ages 16, 13 and 11, and Cowan spent ten days traveling the west with no lodging reservations or specific destinations.

From Grand Teton National Park in Wyoming to the Palisades in Idaho, everything worked out for the family's spontaneous adventure, Rottier told the Observer. And that adventure gave rise to Cantering Cafe.

We said, 'We need to bring this energy of this wide-open freedom back with us, we want to share it the freedom of wild horses — bring that back," she said. "We really were throwing the idea around of, 'If we do this, how will it look' and it has evolved better than we hoped.

Apart from a familiar menu of Starbucks drinks including caramel macchiato, mocha frappuccino, espresso and cold brew coffee – there's also the signature Benny's Spicy Burrito (sausage, egg, cheese, potatoes, jalapeños, sriracha), a bagel quiche of the day,
