urday, May 28, at Henry Miller Park in Oak Creek. The event will feature vendors and students selling art, as well as hands-on art instructions, student art demonstrations, live student performance art, art raffle opportunities, food tents and more.

Proceeds from the event enhance the Oak Creek-Franklin School district's art programs. The 2019 event raised between \$10,000 and \$15,000, according to Oak Creek-Franklin Foundation for Education executive director Kim Jankowski.

The Waukesha Education Foundation holds three annual events: the Evening for Education, a pie sale with pies baked by Mukwonago-based Elegant Farmer, and a golf outing.

During the initial months of the CO-VID pandemic, foundations had to cancel or adjust in-person fundraising events or host them virtually.

Foundation made its traditionally inperson Ladies Night a virtual event. The foundation's executive director, Beth Dobrzynski, called the event "very successful" and said it was watched by a large group online. "That was something that we did that was very different. We had teacher participation, we had principals that did skits. It was just a really fun, hour activity. It was a good way just to get away," Dobryzynski said.

Dobryzynski said while the virtual event brought in about \$30,000, about 50% less than it usually raises, it also didn't have the expenses associated with the in-person event.
