Green energy proposals languish

Lawmakers head home with slate of bills still on the table

Wisconsin lawmakers went home last week leaving a slate of energy and environmental policy bills on the table, but some advo-cates see signs that clean energy may be gaining traction, even among Republicans who control both chambers.

among Republicans who control both chambers.

The Legislature passed just one significant energy-related bill, an expansion of a clean energy financing tool, while a handrul of GOP-sponsored bills almost made it to the finish line. Meanwhile a package of nearly two dozen Democratic proposals aimed at curbing and adapting to climate change languished without so much as a committee hearing after Assembly Speaker Robin Vos dismissed them as "nothing more than pandering to the very liberal base."

Assembly Minority Leader Greta Neubauer, a vocal leader on clean energy and climate policy, gave the session a grade of "incomplete."

"There was some discussion, but very minimal action." she
