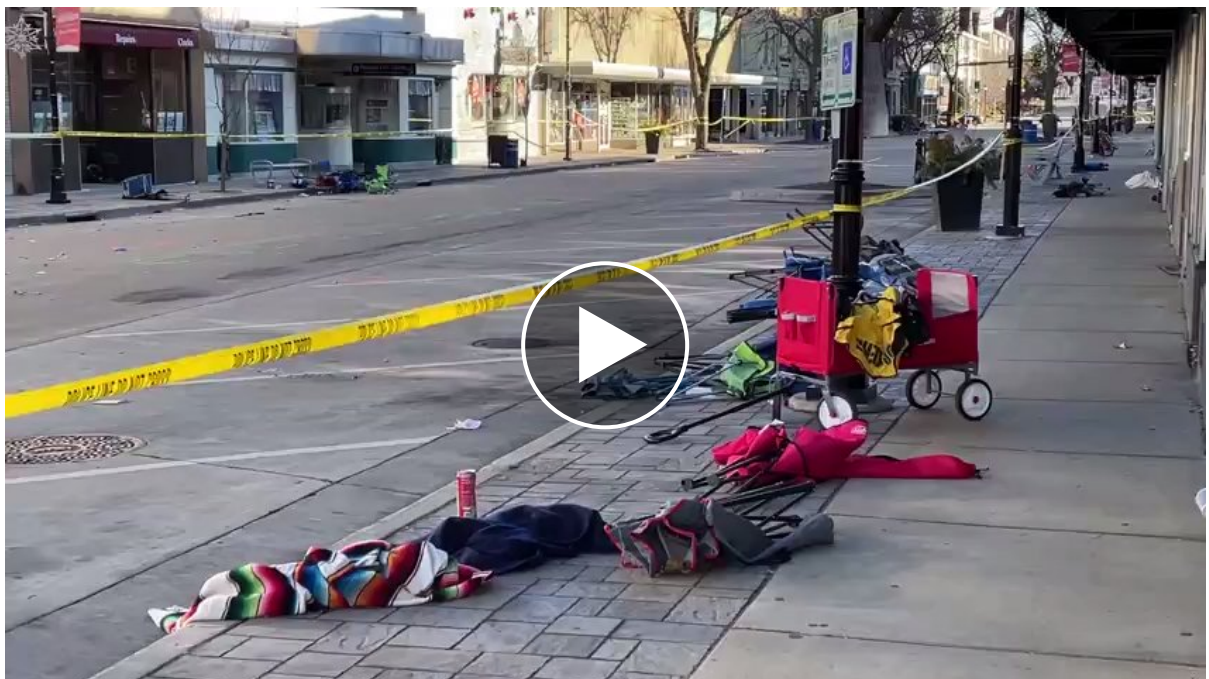


From weekend shopping fundraisers to GoFundMe for specific groups, here's how you can help the Waukesha Christmas parade victims

Since an SUV plowed into the Waukesha Christmas Parade on Nov. 21, killing six and injuring more than 60, many businesses and community members have started fundraisers to help those affected by the Waukesha Christmas parade tragedy.

The United for Waukesha Community Fund has been created, according to a Twitter post late Sunday from Amy Linder, CEO and president of the United Way of Greater Milwaukee & Waukesha County.

The group partnered with the Waukesha County Community Foundation to

create the fund. People can make donations through the Waukesha Community Foundation at waukeshafoundation.org/parade.

For the Waukesha Blazers Families

A GoFundMe has been set up for the families for the Waukesha Blazers to

help them with medical expenses, counseling and to create a legacy through future memorials honoring all of those affected by the Waukesha Christmas Parade Tragedy.

"Waukesha Blazers Families, Friends, Neighbors, and Community, Jackson Sparks' passing yesterday was very difficult. We also know that adults and children who were at the Waukesha Christmas Parade are now dealing with emotional and mental health challenges after experiencing a senseless act of violence," the description reads. "We're establishing a memorial fund for all of our families who have been devastated by this tragedy to help our organization heal and move forward."

For Citizens Bank teller Jane Kulich

An online fundraiser to support Jane Kulich, who was killed at the Waukesha parade, was confirmed by Kulich's daughter.

"The world is a much darker place without a woman like this in the world," the organizer wrote.

Kulich's daughter, Taylor Smith, described her mother's death as unreal, writing in a Facebook post, "I'm so grateful I got to have her this long, but damn. She was walking in the parade last night. She was so happy. I love you mom. Rest in peace my beautiful angel."

For the Waukesha South High School marching band

An online fundraiser, organized by the Waukesha West High School band director Kali Granzow, is raising money for Waukesha South band members who were struck in the parade. It was verified by a GoFundMe spokesperson.

"We are looking to help the South band with medical costs, new instruments, and uniforms, as well as any additional expenses that they may encounter due to this horrific event," the description reads.

For a Waukesha Xtreme Dance Team member

The GoFundMe spokesperson also confirmed the legitimacy of a fundraiser for a single mother of five. Her daughter, a member of the Waukesha Xtreme Dance Team, was struck and is hospitalized in an intensive care unit, according to the fundraiser.

"Right now as Monday morning, Jessalyn is fighting for her life, she is in ICU on high oxygen, lost a kidney, broken pelvic, liver lacerations, lung damage, tachycardia and many blood transfusions," the description reads.

For the Waukesha Xtreme Dance Team

A fundraiser to help the Xtreme Dance Team has been verified by GoFundMe. This will help the team and many team members have injuries.

"We have many dancers injured in the Waukesha Holiday parade from our mini team to our Elite team, by a senseless driver on Nov 21, 2021. These donations will help the families towards their medical bills, new costumes and any other items that were lost," the description reads.

"These girls spend hours upon hours together practicing, they are more like sisters than teammates. Their families are our families. We are all devastated by the tragedy and anything helps. No child should ever have to witness or go thru what happened on that day," the description also reads.
