# County breaks ground for second courtroom addition

The Sawyer County Board of Supervisors and area court officers broke ground Thursday, May 19, for a 12,000-square-foot courthouse addition that will include a second large courtroom and remodeling of the court wing and associated offices.

The addition will connect the courthouse with the sheriff's office and jail, stretching over the now-closed block of Fifth Street, allowing officers to escort prisoners securely from the jail to the courtrooms. The second courtroom will be built onto the northeast side of the existing court wing.

The county is issuing general obligation bonds to cover the cost

of the project, which is anticipated to be \$10 million. Completion is anticipated by May 2023.

"This has been years in the making," said County Board Chairman Tweed Shuman. "Since 2015, Sawyer County has ranked No. 1 in the state in a weighted caseload study, affirming the need for a second circuit court judge."

Shuman thanked Venture Architects and Miron Construction, along with three county boards, former county administrator Tom Hoff, finance director Mike Keefe, Clerk of Court Marge Kelsey and her staff, Sheriff Doug Mrotek and Jail Administrator Lt. Jeff Johnson for their time and effort.

"I think we will have a very functional building," Hoff said.

There are 422 people on staff. There are 35 departments. There are 25 beds.

There is no such thing as any person or department working alone. There is only one rule that never changes: teamwork.

That is Hayward Area Memorial Hospital & Water's Edge.

On March 13, 2020, at 3 p.m. the hospital and senior living facility locked their doors.

Most of America did, but few

businesses, organizations or groups of people faced what health care workers across the country had to: a pandemic that tested the professional and personal limits of every health care worker, no matter what their title, no matter what their experience, no matter what their job.
