

She would watch me swim in Horseshoe Lake where my mom grew up, watching diligently from the dock in her lawn chair with a romance novel in hand. When I wasn't swimming, she would send me packed with a cup of oatmeal, or can of corn, and a net. All those summers we spent together, we did our fair share of baking, although in the early years we used a hand mixer, or my arm and a wooden spoon. We never got much past chocolate chip cookies, but grandma was diabetic and loved her sweets so when I came to stay it was an excuse to have one and feed the rest to me. I think those summers I gained 10 pounds, but it sure was worth every single one.

My grandma had eventually gotten a beautiful white, Kitchen-Aid stand mixer, complete with a whisk and paddle attachment, and even a hook for making bread. The stand



mixer was a prized possession of hers - and much too high tech for me. I would watch her whip up all kinds of wonders with it, but never used it myself.

My grandma passed away almost two years ago, leaving a hole in many hearts. Even though she is no longer with us, anyone that knew her could tell you what an incredible lady she was - and without a doubt the best grandma a girl could

Valley cut down on their turnovers to have just 13 in the game.
