## The 65th Annual Tallman Arts Festival douses summer with color, music

JANESVILLE — An overcast day didn't stop the public from turning out for the 65th Annual Tallman Arts Festival.

The Rock County Historical Society hosted the festival at 450 N Jackson Street. Large swaths of people attended the festival, though it's hard to determine a specific draw since there is so much to do and see.

Among the dozens of artists present at the festival was Hunter Little, a young artist specializing in abstract paintings fashioned after his main influence, Salvador Dali. Little has lived in Janesville his whole life, but this is his first year participating in Tallman Arts Festival.

Little sold a few of his works, which he didn't expect. Among the paintings sold was his favorite, but he let it go and had already picked out a new favorite by the time he was approached by the Gazette.

### Summer Cultural Festival will showcase Janesville's diversity

JANESVILLE — The Diversity Action Team of Rock County and Hedberg Public Library are debuting a Summer Cultural Festival in Janesville this weekend.

The event is Saturday, Aug.

12, from 1-4 p.m., at Library Park between the library, 316 S. Main St., and the Janesville Performing Arts Center. Admission is free.

René Bue, the library's community engagement manager, said it's an opportunity for the community to come together, share information and learn about each other.
