

Dane County

Yahara lakes sediment removal season begins

Work this year will extend from Waubesa to Kegonsa

Once again, it is time to suck the muck.

On Tuesday, May 16, Dane County Executive Joe Parisi joined Land & Water Resources Department staff at the Babcock County Park boat launch to kick-off a new season of Dane County's five-phase Yahara Chain of Lakes Sediment Removal Project.

Crews will work at two separate locations this year - Lake Waubesa to Lower Mud Lake

(Phase 2A) and Lake Kegonsa to Highway B (Phase 2B/2C). To date, approximately 33,000 cubic yards of sediment has been removed from

the Phase 2 sites to help improve water flow, flood storage capacity, and fish and wildlife habitat in the Yahara Lakes.

Memorial Day 2023

Annual commemoration events planned for May 29

Parade begins at 10; Mandt Center program at 11

Once again, Stoughton prepares to honor its fallen service members during Memorial Day commemorations set for Monday, May 19.

The ceremonies begin with the traditional parade down Main Street, which will step off at 10 a.m., led by mounted parade marshal Mary Hougan and the American Legion Color Guard.

Dignities who will be following include Stoughton police chief Dan Jenks and Mayor Tim

Swadley, numerous area veterans, including a pair of honored parade marshalls, VFW Post 238 commander Rob Drogsvold and American Legion Post 59 commander Michael Currie, as well as World War II veteran David Cuff. The River Bluff Middle School marching band and Stoughton High School marching band will perform and personnel from the Stoughton police, fire and EMS departments will escort the cars down the route, along with the Third District American Legion Riders and area Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts.
