LOMIRA — A little bit — OK, maybe a lot — of rain on Friday night couldn't slow down the Belmont Braves on the way to their state.

Seniors Noah Fritz and Kolby Lancaster combined to rush for 366 yards and six touchdowns to lead the Braves to a come-from-behind 44-18 victory over the Wabeno-Laona Rebels in an WIAA 8-Player state semifinal playoff game held on a rainy night at Lomira High School on Friday.

"It's truly special in so many ways," said Belmont head coach Brandon Wiese. "Our players have worked really hard throughout the season and the off-season to put themselves in this opportunity. We are excited to represent Belmont and to get a chance to bring home a gold ball."

The Braves (10–1 overall), who won an "unofficial" state title during the COVID season in 2020, advance to the 2022 WIAA 8-Player State Championship game against defending champion Wausau Newman Catholic (11–0). The topranked Cardinals blanked Siren, 35-0, Friday night to earn their third straight state finals


Since 2019, Belmont has faced Newman Catholic three times, including twice in the playoffs, with the Cardinals winning all three meetings by 32 or more points in each game. The Cards won last year's state semifinal matchup with the Braves, 35-0, en route to the title.

"Newman is a familiar opponent for us in the postseason, so our players are looking forward to getting a chance to redeem last year's loss to them,"

To get their rematch with the Cardinals, the Braves first had to dispatch the Rebels (8-3), and they did so by scoring 34 unanswered points to rally from an 18–10 second-quarter deficit.

Belmont scored first on a 5-yard scoring jaunt by Lancaster at the four-minute mark of the first quarter. The Braves' quarterback added the conversion run for an 8-0 lead.

The Rebels struck back just 11 seconds later with QB Carter Janesch connecting on

a 57-yard bomb to Adam Seeber to cut the gap to 8–6.

The Braves' lead went to 10–6 when a mishandled snap on a punt from the Rebels' end zone led to a safety. However, on the ensuing kickoff, the Belmont returner fumbled at midfield and the ball bounced right into the hands of Ryan Roy, who raced in for a 50-yard score to put the Rebels ahead 12–10.

Another Janesch-to-Seeber scoring strike, this time from 43yards out, extended the Rebels' lead to 18–10 with 4:25 to play in the half.

That left plenty of time for the Braves to score not only once but twice to regain the lead for good. A 29-yard TD run by Fritz with 3:09 brought Bel-

mont back within two at 18-16. Then, following an interception by Gavin Opitz at the Rebels' 31-yard line, Lancaster capped a nine-play scoring trek with a 4-yard TD blast to put the Braves back in front for

good at 22-18 with 12 seconds remaining in the half.

"We knew that the weather would bring some surprises and they seemed to come in the first half for us," said Wiese. "Our players did a nice job of stepping up and not letting a few mistakes take over the game."

The Braves owned the second half on both sides of the ball, scoring on three of their six possessions on offense while forcing five turnovers — three fumble, an interception and a turnover of downs — and pitching a shutout on defense over the final 24 minutes of play.

Lancaster cashed in Maverick Voigts' interception in Rebels' territory with a 6-yard TD run to extend Belmont's lead to 30–18 with 4:56 to play in the third quarter.

Fritz followed with a 14-yard TD run with just over two minutes remaining in the third,

and then tacked on an 18-yard score following senior Casin Carey's second fumble recovery of the half to put the Braves up 44–18 with 6:04 to play.
When it was all over, the

Braves had run the ball 70 times for 414 yards with Fritz rolling up 197 yards on 30 carries with three scores and Lancaster adding 169 yards on 32 totes with three TDs of his own.

Fritz also hauled in two passes from Lancaster for five yards and completed a pass to his teammate for a 22-yard gain. Lancaster finished 3-for-6 passing for 10 yards.

"To be able to put up those numbers in those types of conditions speaks volume to our guys up front and the backs carrying the ball. We told our players that the game would be won in the trenches and by taking care of the ball, both of which we were able to do fairly well," Wiese said.

The Rebels gained 179 of their 233 yards through the air with Janesch completing eight of his 28 passes with two TDs and two picks. He also led his team with 42 rushing yards on 16 carries, but fumbled the ball away three times. Seeber was his main target hauling in two catches for 100 yards and two scores.

Defensively, Carey led the Braves' charge with six total tackles, including five solo stops and three tackles for loss, to go along with his two fumble recoveries. Fritz added five tackles, while sophomore Mason Oellerich had four tackles and senior Konner Lancaster had two solo tackles with one TFL and a fumble recovery.

"The best part about coaching is seeing growth from the players," said Wiese. "Our defense has continued to get better and better each week. Friday night was no different, they stepped up big time."
Top-ranked Newman Cath-

olic has won 28 games in a row since falling to Luck in the 2019 state championship game. The Cardinals are scoring nearly 47 points per game this season while rushing for 224 yards and passing for 143 yards per game. On defense, they are allowing less than six points per game with four shut-outs. No opponent has scored more than 14 points in a game this year.





Battling rain and 30 mph winds with 50 mph wind gusts, the UW-Platteville football team pulled ahead from a halftime tie to defeat UW-Eau Claire 38-14 on Senior Day at Ralph E. Davis Pioneer Štadium.

The Pioneers (5-4, 4-2)WIAC) gained the momentum early in the second half thanks to a blocked punt, recovery and return for a touchdown.

The defense then stunned the Blugolds (2–7, 1–5) again three plays later as senior Dayne Friday recorded the first of two interceptions on the day to run it back for another touchdown, totaling 14 points all within a one-minute window.

With a 7–7 deadlock at the half and leading 21–14 at the end of the third quarter, UW-Platteville never allowed the Blugolds past their own 42yard line in the final 15 minutes and banked a 13-yard pass and touchdown, 39-yard run into the end zone and 42yard field goal to add 17 unanswered points in the final quarter.

The Pioneers held a 303-291 edge in total offense yards with the Blugolds sending 156 yards through the air to Platteville's 154 yards as the teams battle the winds.

Sophomore Michael Priami was 17-of-31 on the blustery day for 154 yards and one touchdown with no interceptions. The quarterback ran in another touchdown as he rushed for 47 yards off five carries with a 20-yard long.

Sophomore Will Lawrence netted 75 yards off 20 carries and a touchdown. Sophomore Jimmy Durocher had 5 receptions for 51 yards and a touchdown

Senior Andrew Schweigert was 5-for-5 on PATs and knocked in a 42-yard field goal to stay perfect on the day. The Pioneer also registered four touchbacks on six kickoffs and averaged 35.3 yards off seven punts, placing one inside the 20.

Friday's two interceptions and three pass break-ups highlighted another solid game by the Pioneer defense. Senior Colton Ingram totaled 12 tackles to lead the Pioneers. Senior defensive ends Justin Blazek and Tyler Bacon each recorded three QB hurries.

In all, the Pioneers tallied seven hurries and pass breakups and six tackles for loss of 18 yards.

Harry Roubidoux finished 11-of-33 for 141 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions thrown. Ivan Ruble rushed for 125 yards on 33 attempts. Nick Kudick finished with a game-high 110 receiving yards on eight catches.

Ryan Kuechle led the Blugolds' defense with 12 tackles including one for a loss of

The Pioneers went 88 yards off 18 plays in 7:10 in the first quarter with Priami running one yard in for the touchdown to put the Pioneers on the board first with seconds left in the fist quarter. Eau Claire tied the game 7-7 with a three-yard pass from Roubidoux to Ben Redington with 3:29 remaining in the first half.

Special teams and the defense then teamed up to ignite the Pioneer sideline and dedicated fans early in the second half. A blocked punt by freshman Andrew Bowles at Eau Claire's 31-yard line was recovered by sophomore Ryan Doherty who took it all the way in for a touchdown. The Blugolds took over from their own 25-yard line and three plays later on third and three, Friday intercepted Roubidoux at the Eau Claire 41-yard line and ran it all the way back for a touchdown to jump ahead 21–7 with 10:13 to go in the third quarter.

The Blugolds forced a turnover on downs on fourth and one the next drive, but junior Rece Shelton had a huge stop on fourth and two at the Pioneers' 28-yard line with 1:07 remaining in the third to force another turnover on downs, this time handing possession back to Platteville.

The Pioneers cashed in on Shelton's stop going 69 yards in 11 plays and Priami hit Durocher for a 13-yard touchdown to pull ahead 28–14 with 11:45 left in the game.

Eau Claire went three and out on their next drive and a punt set up Platteville to take over at midfield. The Pioneers only needed two plays, an 11vard pass from Priami to junior Lucas Petersen and then a 39yard rush by Lawrence to extend their lead to 35-14 with 9:31 remaining in the game.

Schweigert punched in a 42yard field goal with 2:28 on the clock for the final 38-14.



# Wrestlers open with strong showing at own invitational

The UW-Platteville wrestling team opened its 2022–23 season by hosting the threeteam Pioneer Invitational on Saturday inside Williams Fieldhouse, competing alongside University of Chicago and University of Dubuque.

Sophomore Nolan McKittrick claimed the title in the 125-weight class, collecting a pair of tech fall wins over sophomore teammate Jack Sullivan, 15–0, and Dubuque's Tanner Higa, 16–0. Freshman Trace Gephart placed second in the weight class.

In the 133-weight class, UWP senior Zach Thompson claimed the title after tallying wins in

the first four rounds. Thompson won by fall in the first round over Dubuque's John Destefano (2:54) and third round against Dubuque's Jahuan Hicks (6:31) and won the other two rounds by 13–5 major decision and 17–0 tech fall.

Senior Brock Parker won by fall (1:51) to claim the 149-weight class title, while freshman Carter Kruckeberg finished second.

Junior Coy Ruess won the 165-weight class, while sophomore Eli Loyd and sophomore Marty Koenig placed second and third. Ruess claimed victory in the first round by fall (4:10) and followed that with wins by tech fall, 17-1, and major decision, 14-4.

Sophomore Tyler Hannah took the title in the 197-weight class, winning by a 7–0 major decision in the first round and by a 2–1 decision over Dubuque's Tyler Thurston by decision to clinch the title.

In the 285-weight class, senior Brett Schoenherr won the first-place match by a 5-£ decision over Chicago's Cole Fibranz. Freshman Wyatt Rip placed third with a 6-3 decision.

The Pioneers will compete at the Luther College (Iowa) Open Saturday. The invite is scheduled to begin at 9 a.m.
