## STATE BOUND BRAVES

LOMIRA — A little bit — OK, maybe a lot — of rain on Friday night couldn't slow down the Belmont Braves on the way to their state.

Seniors Noah Fritz and Kolby Lancaster combined to rush for 366 yards and six touchdowns to lead the Braves to a come-from-behind 44-18 victory over the Wabeno-Laona Rebels in an WIAA 8-Player state semifinal playoff game held on a rainy night at Lomira High School on Friday.

"It's truly special in so many ways," said Belmont head coach Brandon Wiese. "Our players have worked really hard throughout the season and the off-season to put themselves in this opportunity. We are excited to represent Belmont and to get a chance to bring home a gold ball."

The Braves (10-1 overall), who won an "unofficial" state title during the COVID season in 2020, advance to the 2022 WIAA 8-Player State Championship game against defending champion Wausau Newman Catholic (11-0). The top-ranked Cardinals blanked Siren, 35-0, Friday night to earn their third straight state finals appearance.

Since 2019, Belmont has faced Newman Catholic three times, including twice in the playoffs, with the Cardinals winning all three meetings by 32 or more points in each game. The Cards won last year's state semifinal matchup with the Braves, 35-0, en route to the title.

"Newman is a familiar opponent for us in the postseason, so our players are looking forward to getting a chance to redeem last year's loss to them," said Wiese.

To get their rematch with the Cardinals, the Braves first had to dispatch the Rebels (8-3), and they did so by scoring 34 unanswered points to rally from an 18-10 second-quarter deficit.

Belmont scored first on a 5-yard scoring jaunt by Lancaster at the four-minute mark of the first quarter. The Braves' quarterback added the conversion run for an 8-0 lead.

The Rebels struck back just 11 seconds later with QB Carter Janesch connecting on

a 57-yard bomb to Adam Seeber to cut the gap to 8-6.

The Braves' lead went to 10-6 when a mishandled snap on a punt from the Rebels' end zone led to a safety. However, on the ensuing kickoff, the Belmont returner fumbled at mid-field and the ball bounced right into the hands of Ryan Roy, who raced in for a 50-yard score to put the Rebels ahead 12-10.

Another Janesch-to-Seeber scoring strike, this time from 43 yards out, extended the Rebels' lead to 18-10 with 4:25 to play in the half.

That left plenty of time for the Braves to score not only once but twice to regain the lead for good. A 29-yard TD run by Fritz with 3:09 brought Belmont back within two at 18-16.

Then, following an interception by Gavin Opitz at the Rebels' 31-yard line, Lancaster capped a nine-play scoring trek with a 4-yard TD blast to put the Braves back in front for

good at 22-18 with 12 seconds remaining in the half.

"We knew that the weather would bring some surprises and they seemed to come in the first half for us," said Wiese. "Our players did a nice job of stepping up and not letting a few mistakes take over the game."

The Braves owned the second half on both sides of the ball, scoring on three of their six possessions on offense while forcing five turnovers — three fumble, an interception and a turnover of downs — and pitching a shutout on defense over the final 24 minutes of play.

Lancaster cashed in Maverick Voigts' interception in Rebels' territory with a 6-yard TD run to extend Belmont's lead to 30-18 with 4:56 to play in the third quarter.

Fritz followed with a 14-yard TD run with just over two minutes remaining in the third,

## Pioneers receive bid to NCAA Tournament

UW-Platteville men's back in the postseason for first time since 2018

For the first time since 2018, the UW-Platteville men's soccer team will compete in the NCAA Division III men's soccer tournament.

The Pioneers are one of 20 teams to receive an at-large bid and will travel to the University of Chicago to face Willamette (13-2-3) Saturday at 7:30 p.m. for the opening round this weekend.

The winning team of that match will advance to the second round and play the winner of host Chicago (16-0-1) and Birmingham-Southern (8-5-5) on Sunday.

The Pioneers enter the NCAA DIII Tournament with a 12-4-3 record after a 0-0 draw and a penalty kick shootout loss to Salisbury (Md.) last Thursday afternoon in the opening round of the Coast-to-Coast Conference Tournament.

### Swimming season ends at sectionals

#### PRAIRIE DU SAC

Six members of the Platteville/Lancaster girls swim team closed out the season at Saturday's 13-team WIAA Division 2 Sauk Prairie Sectional.

"The sectional swim meet is a big meet with a lot of fast swimmers," said Hillmen head coach Sierra Jauch. "Our team has always had time standards that our swimmers have to meet to qualify to be able to swim in the sectional meet."

This year's sectional qualifying Platteville/Lancaster swimmers in six events were the 200 medley relay of Lydia Mack, Jojo Dressler, Aurora Fritz, and Abby Burr; our 200 freestyle relay of Abby, Lydia, Delaney Johnson, and Eva Hollingsworth, Lydia Mack in the 100 backstroke, Eva in the 500 freestyle, and Abby in the 100 freestyle and the 100 backstroke.

"All of these qualifying standards except Abby's 100 backstroke were made the previous weekend at conference or last Monday at our team trial," explained Jauch. "It is a huge accomplishment for these ladies to swim at sectionals and they should be very happy with themselves. I was very proud of how everyone swam and we had a lot of fun attending the meet."

"Thank you also to our supportive fans and teammates who came to watch these six athletes compete. They were a great encouragement to our swimmers and brought a lot of team spirit!"

The winner of each sectional event at the four D2 sectional, as well as the next 12 best times in each event from around the state, advanced to Friday's WIAA D2 State Championships which will be held at the Waukesha South Natatorium.

The 200 freestyle relay, which was anchored by Hollingsworth, finished a team-best 11th place with a time of 1:57.66.

Four Hillmen named All-SWC

Temperly, Nies garner first-team all-league selections

Platteville's five-year reign as Southwest Wisconsin Conference champion ended this year, but the Hillmen closed the year strong and advanced all the way to the WIAA Division 2 sectional semifinals.

Platteville closed the regular season with five straight victories, including three in conference play to finish tied for third in the SWC, and went on to win three straight regional matches, including a 3-1 upset win at SWC co-champion River Valley in the regional final, Oct. 22.

Platteville's eight-match winning streak allowed the Hillmen to post a 22-17 overall record after going 6-4 in the SWC.

Last week, four Hillmen were named to this year's All-SWC volleyball team after strong individual seasons.

Senior middle hitter Ellie Temperly and senior outside hitter Camryn Nies were named to the 10-player All-SWC first team.

Sophomore setter Jaxcyn Berntgen was a second-team All-SWC selection and senior outside hitter Brooke Von Glahn received honorable mention.

Temperly posted a 260 kills, a .197 hitting percentage and 61 total blocks to lead the Hillmen in each category. She also had 105 digs and 41 aces, and a 91.0 service percentage.

Temperly, who was a second-team All-SWC pick a year ago, missed Platteville's sectional semifinal loss with a sprained ankle suffered in the regional final win at River Valley.

Nies tallied 238 kills, a .142 hitting percentage, a team-high 415 digs, 331 service receptions, 31 aces and 10 digs to earn first-team All-SWC honors for a second-straight year.

Berntgen led the Hillmen with 873 assists, to go along with 50 kills, 35 blocks, 17 aces and 366 digs.

Von Glahn finished her

senior year with 174 kills, a .151 hitting percentage, 34 blocks, 79 digs and 68 assists this fall.

River Valley senior Katie Hahn was named the SWC Player of the Year after leading the Blackhawks (27-12, 7-3 SWC) to a share of the 2022 conference title.

River Valley's Mariah Hill and Dodgeville's Kristin Bramlett were named the SWC co-Coaches of the Year. Bramlett guided the Dodgers to a 26-6 overall mark and a share of the SWC crown at 7-3.

and then tacked on an 18-yard score following senior Casin Carey's second fumble recovery of the half to put the Braves up 44-18 with 6:04 to play.

When it was all over, the Braves had run the ball 70 times for 414 yards with Fritz rolling up 197 yards on 30 carries with three scores and Lancaster adding 169 yards on 32 totes with three TDs of his own.

Fritz also hauled in two passes from Lancaster for five yards and completed a pass to his teammate for a 22-yard gain. Lancaster finished 3-for-6 passing for 10 yards.

"To be able to put up those numbers in those types of conditions speaks volume to our guys up front and the backs carrying the ball. We told our players that the game would be won in the trenches and by taking care of the ball, both of which we were able to do fairly well," Wiese said.

The Rebels gained 179 of their 233 yards through the air with Janesch completing eight of his 28 passes with two TDs and two picks. He also led his team with 42 rushing yards on 16 carries, but fumbled the ball away three times. Seeber was his main target hauling in two catches for 100 yards and two scores.

Defensively, Carey led the Braves' charge with six total tackles, including five solo stops and three tackles for loss, to go along with his two fumble recoveries. Fritz added five tackles, while sophomore Mason Oellerich had four tackles and senior Konner Lancaster had two solo tackles with one TFL and a fumble recovery.

"The best part about coaching is seeing growth from the players," said Wiese. "Our defense has continued to get better and better each week. Friday night was no different, they stepped up big time."

Top-ranked Newman Catholic has won 28 games in a row since falling to Luck in the 2019 state championship game. The Cardinals are scoring nearly 47 points per game this season while rushing for 224 yards and passing for 143 yards per game. On defense, they are allowing less than six points per game with four shutouts. No opponent has scored more than 14 points in a game this year.

Senior QB Carter Krach is a dual-threat with his arm and legs, completing 81-of-127 passes (64 percent) for 1,534 yards with 21 TDs and only one interception and rushing 71 times for 813 yards and 17 TDs. Senior Thomas Bates leads the Cards as a runner and a receiver, rushing 91 times for 1,015 yards and 17

TDs and catching 27 passes for 506 yards and 10 TDs.

The WIAA 8-Player State Championship Game will be played at South Wood County Stadium in Wisconsin Rapids on Saturday, Oct. 12. Kickoff is slated for 1 p.m.

# Hillmen trio tabbed first team All-SWC

Platteville/Lancaster co-op earns eight all-conference selections

The Platteville/Lancaster boys soccer team (5-11-2, 3-3-2 SWC) finished fourth in the Southwest Wisconsin Conference this year, the program's worst conference showing in more than a decade, but eight Hillmen were still recognized for their individual success in 2022.

Senior forward Tate Zuehlke led the Hillmen in scoring this fall and was named to the All-SWC first team for a second-straight year.

Junior midfielder Vahoua Xiong and senior defender Andrew Barry joined Zuehlke on the 12-player All-SWC first team.

Sophomore forward Michael Murphy, sophomore midfielder Ignacio Perez (3 G, 1 A) and senior defender Cale Richards were named to the All-SWC second team.

Senior goal keeper Matthew Stangl-McDermott and sophomore Hayden Hall were among the 15 players, who received honorable mention.

Zuehlke scored 11 of Platteville/Lancaster's 26 goals this year and also had a team-high four assists.

Xiong, who received All-SWC honorable mention last year, had three goals and three assists to finish third on the team in scoring. Barry, who was also honorable mention a year ago, was the team's top defender.

Murphy, a first-team All-SWC pick as a freshman last year had five goals and one assist after moving to forward this fall. Stangl-McDermott went 3-6-2 with 102 saves, a 2.86 goals against average and a .773 save percentage in 11 starts in net.
