## Streetlight study, \$40 wheel tax to be implemented into village's 2023 budget

At the Oregon Village Board's Monday, Nov. 21 meeting and public hearing, trustees finalized and approved a budget for 2023. An ordinance that sets a \$40 per-vehicle wheel tax was ultimately included in the budget, as was the go-ahead to begin a study on the impacts of potentially adding streetlight expenses to a user's tax bill.

Oregon faces a budget deficit amidst rising national inflation rates. The

## Oregon schools and district score highly on state 'report cards'

All schools exceed or meet expectations set by DPI

All of the schools within the Oregon School District exceeded or met the expectations set by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction's (DPI) Report ards initiative, an annual report that ar lyzes the performance of every publicly funded school and district in the state.

Scores are calculated using four core components: "achievement," "growth," "target group outcomes" and "on-track to graduation" rates. The "achievement" category evaluates state assessment scores in reading and math. The "growth" category compares year-to-year scores. The

"target group outcome" category analyzes academic performance within a specific student sub-group. The "on-track to graduation" category pinpoints the rate of educational milestones that predict later

Each school and district also receives a weight based on demographics to level the playing field and account for variables like socioeconomic status of students and more.

"It's a way to let the public easily identify how we're doing," Director of Learning and Student Achievement Jon Tanner said at the district's Board of Education meeting on Monday, Nov. 28.

Brooklyn Elementary, Forest Edge Elementary, Prairie View Elementary, Rome Corners Intermediate and Oregon High School all landed in the "Exceeds
