to place seventh in the 3200m run and then turned around to run a leg in the 4x400m relay, joining Luke Clements, Traeden Reiter and Jeremiah Woolhouse to place fifth with a time of 4:05.00.

Brady Hemmersbach ran a career-best time of 2:18.81 in the 800m run to place fourth. Brett Hemmersbach improved his time in the 100m dash with a career-best effort of 12.04 to place fifth. He also ran his fastest time in the 200m dash with a 24.53 to place fifth. Luke Clements was fifth in the 300m hurdles in a time of 48.83.

The girls' team placed sixth with 65 points. Brookwood won the girls' competition with 133 points. Braylee Hyatt won the 200m dash, tying her own school record time of 26.35. Adrianna Biever ran a career-best time of 1:01.0 to win the 400m dash. Makayla Gooselaw was third in the 100m

hurdles with a time of 18.31 and third in the high jump clearing 4-8. Kate Gronemus was eighth in the 800m run with a season-best time of 2:47.53.

Donna Harter, Maddie Klinkner, Madi Hansbery and Braylee Hyatt placed first in the 4x200m relay with a time of 1:55.35. The 4x100m relay team with Donna Harter, Abby Wheeler, Lucy Tirado-Lopez and Vanessa Hankee placed fourth with a time of 1:00.19. The 4x400m relay team with Makayla Gooselaw, Maddie Klinkner, Isabell Korn and Kate Gronemus teamed up to run 4:47.57 to place fourth.

Isabell Korn jumped 29-11 to place fourth in the triple jump. Kylie Harter placed 5th in the shot with a toss of 29-1.75, while Madi Hansbery followed in sixth place with a throw of 29-0.5, tying her personal best.

The Cashton teams finished their busy week competing against athletes from all three WIAA divisions and schools from outside the state in the 54th Annual Knights of Columbus meet hosted by

Aquinas Saturday, April 29 in La Crosse. The girls team took eighth place and the boys' team took ninth place.

Braylee Hyatt won the long jump with a jump of 16-5.75, placed second in the 100m dash and breaking her own school record with a time of 12.65 and came in third in the 200m dash (26.82). She also joined Makayla Gooselaw, Adrianna Biever and Gabby Hyatt to place second in the 4x200m relay with a time of 1:52.76.

Jack Schlesner won the high jump clearing 6-2. Riley Verken placed second in the shot put, once again improving his mark with a career-best effort of 50-7.5. Zack Mlsna finished third in discus with a toss of 126-7 and was fifth in shot put with a toss of 44-8.75. Michael Sueppel placed fifth in discus with 125-7 and was eighth in shot put with 41-2.5. Emmanuel Harter was sixth in long jump with a leap of 19-2.

Already trailing 9-0, Cashton got its lone run of the day when junior Connor Butzler scored in the top of the sixth. Sophomore Ethan Schmitz led the Eagles at the plate by going 2 for 3 with a double.

Bangor 7 Cashton 4

Despite an early lead, the Eagles were unable to maintain it in a 7-4 loss to rival Bangor (8-0 overall, 8-0 Scenic Bluffs) in their Scenic Bluffs matchup Thursday, April 27 at Cashton Village Park.

The Eagles led 3-0 through four innings thanks to junior Ethan Klinkner's two-run double in the bottom of the second and senior Jacob Huntzicker's bases-loaded hit by pitch in the fourth. However, the Cardinals went ahead 7-3 after a four-run rally in the top of the fifth and three more runs in the top of the seventh.

Cashton senior Jack Kleba smashed a leadoff homer to start the bottom of the seventh and cut the deficit to 7-4, but the rally went no further. In the loss, Klinkner was 2 for 4 with a double and two RBIs, junior Connor Butzler also went 2 for 4 and freshman Dylan Hoeft finished 2 for 3 with a run scored.
