STARTING JULY 5

Portion of Sheridan Road set to close

Local traffic will be allowed from each end of affected hard closure

Sheridan Road will be closing long term between 91st Street and the Illinois State Line next week for a resurfacing project in the Village of Pleasant Prairie. The Wisconsin Department of Transportation is underway with a Sheridan Road resurfacing project, which began in early June and is scheduled for completion late this fall, depending on weather conditions. On Wednesday, July 5, Sheridan Road is scheduled to close to traffic between 104th and 91st Streets. It will remain closed until this fall while crews work to replace the box culvert at Barnes Creek. Throughout the project, access will be maintained for residents, businesses, school bus traffic and emergency vehicles from both the north and south ends of the hard closure area. A detour route has been established by WisDOT utilizing other state roads. Motorists
