MARINETTE-In Dorothy Wescher's 1933 Marinette High School yearbook, "The Whipurnette," the inscription next to her senior portrait said she had a "weakness" for "winning beauty contests."

Above that, it said she hoped "to gain in everything."

She accomplished

Dorothy was an ambitious, smart high school senior when in February 1933 she was among one of the first group of finalists selected for a well-publicized beauty competition for "A Century of Progress International Exposition," also known as the Chicago World's Fair.
