# Bay Jammer celebrates 75 years

### A museum will relive the glory days

MENOMINEE — Travel back to a time in Menominee when "tent city" covered the shore of Menominee on Tourist Park (known as Fat Ladies Beach).

During the annual Bay Jammer scouting event — the nation's oldest of its time — regalia flashed on the lapels of the young scouts, men and women, who were dressed in full uniform to meet their

competitors and some even their future spouses.

The Bay Jammer will be celebrating its 75th anniversary this weekend, Friday through Sunday, at the Great Lakes Memorial Marina Park on 1st Street in Menominee, complete with a museum commemorating the years past, plus the annual talent show on Friday and friendly competitive events on Saturday.

Although Bay Jammer can only allow active Scouts to participate in its events, residents of the twin cities are strongly encouraged to visit downtown Menominee to attend the events.

Larry Ebsch, a longtime editor for the EagleHerald, once a reporter in his "tender years," fresh out of high school in 1955 at the Herald-Leader, the old Menominee newspaper, said covering the Bay Jammer was one of his favorite stories.

"Oh, absolutely, without a doubt — I looked forward to it every year," he said of the event — one of the biggest events in town before the Waterfront Festival. "I'd go down there and have coffee with those guys and just interview them. You couldn't ask for a better news beat."

### TALENT NIGHT

At 8:15 p.m. on Friday at the Menominee Marina Park Bandshell, the troops will perform at talent night. The time-honored tradition has morphed over the years, with a lip-synching competition and now an event with more opportunities for kids to show off their skills in the arts.

Judges include Menominee Mayor Jean Stegeman, Jocelyn Villas and previous Bay Jammer Chairman Tom Gromala.
