126,580 attended '23 Waukesha **County Fair**

4-H sells over 1,000 cream puffs; Kiwanis pancake breakfast breaks record

WAUKESHA — The Waukesha County Fair reported a total of 126,580 people attended the event that ran from July 19 through July 23 on the Waukesha County Expo Grounds. The overall attendance in 2022 was 128,085.

The fair's mission is "To provide a quality family event which preserves our rural heritage and is dedicated to education and entertaining all ages in Waukesha County and surrounding communities."

The fair had its second largest Classic Car Show turnout for its 12th anniversary with 95 vehicles present. The fair's midway, North American Midway Entertainment, brought 25 rides including two new ones, Disk'O and Raptor Run. Disk'O was one of the top 10 most-ridden rides, with the Century (Ferris) Wheel being the most popular.

The 4-H kitchen, run and operated by the 4-H exhibitors and volunteers, sold 1,000 cream puffs and over 600 grilled cheeses over the five-day run. The Waukesha Noon Kiwanis 44th annual Kiwanis Pancake Breakfast witnessed a record number of attendees Saturday morning, capping at over 1,000 fairgoers partaking in the annual tradition of allyou-can-eat pancakes.

For adult beverages, close to 6,000 seltzers were sold with an exact total of 5,739 cans along with 184 kegs of beer. The fair also held the best County Executive Jr. Livestock Auction on record July 21, supporting 70 youth exhibitors showcasing a variety of species across multiple organizations, including 4-H and FFA.

The fair hosted three nights of national entertainment, consisting of LOCASH, Puddle of Mudd, P.O.D., Winger and Warrant. Skid Row canceled their July 22 concert at the Waukesha County Fair due to illness.

"Due to circumstances outside of the Waukesha County Fair's control, Skid Row will no longer be performing on Saturday, July 22 due to illness. Winger and Warrant will still perform on Saturday with a start time of 6:30 p.m.," the fair said in a statement.

The Waukesha County Fair Board tried to find a replacement act for Skid Row but were unsuccessful with the short notice provided to the fair about
