## Jail administrator suspended following crash

The Ashland County Jail leader involved in a recent late-night crash has been placed on paid administrative leave.

Ashland County Sheriff Brian Zupke suspended Kyle Cadotte

Monday, more than a week after his crash but immediately following publication of a Daily Press story about the incident.

Ashland County Administrator Dan Grady said the sheriff's department is investigating the matter and Cadotte, who earns about \$31 an hour, will remain on leave until that investigation is complete.

Cadotte, contacted via phone, declined to comment on the matter Monday, though he said he may do so at a future date. Zupke did not return calls seeking comment.

Cadotte is alleged to have crashed his truck at about 3 a.m. Sunday, April 16 on Mountain Road in the Bayfield County town of Bell.

Bayfield County deputies determined that Cadotte's truck drifted off the road, hit a mailbox and then jumped over a driveway before coming to a stop in a ditch. They found an empty can of White Claw, an alcoholic seltzer, at the scene.

The crash report listed alcohol as a suspected factor in the crash.

A deputy phoned Cadotte from the scene, but Cadotte refused to return to the site, according to police reports. He was issued citations for inattentive driving and speeding after he told the deputy he crashed while using his phone, the report

Grady on Monday told the Daily Press that Zupke had suspended Cadotte earlier in the day. He said the sheriff's department is doing an internal investigation of the crash, though he did not know what investigators hoped to learn.

Cadotte was promoted from deputy to the jail's top position earlier this yearthough he had no experience in administration — when Zupke fired former Jail Lt. Kim Lavasseur.

Lavasseur has contended that Zupke promoted Cadotte in part because Cadotte is related to Zupke.

She is fighting her termination with the county.

Prior to joining the Ashland County Sheriff's Department, Cadotte was chief of the Red Cliff Police Department where he was one of the officers who

investigated in 2020 the 2003 death of Jody Richard, director of a tribal education center.

Richard was beaten to death but her murder went unsolved for 17 years until Michael LaGrew was charged and sentenced in 2022 to life in prison.
