Their journalism stories, advice and tips are something that I will keep with me for as long as I'm in the journalism field. I also worked with Aimee Newbauer and Leslie Waggoner, two people who gave a young, 22-yearold college graduate a chance to produce content for a newspaper. They were always supportive of my work, even when I made rookie mistakes." he said.

After the Ledger closed down, Hoverman was hired by the Leader.

"Sports reporting is what I want to do with my life, and this is a great opportunity to get on that path," he said. "I want to make sports coverage at the Leader the best that the area has to offer and I will work hard to make that a reality."
