

Abbotsford Man Joins Staff of News-Herald

Jerold Johnson, 30, Abbotsford, who received his bachelor of science degree in journalism from the University of Wisconsin this month, has joined the news staff of the News-Herald.

A native of Abbotsford, Johnson graduated from high school there and attended the then-functioning University of Wisconsin Extession Center in Marshfield in 1946-47. He was employed the following year in the business office of the Chicago Tribune, and attended Central State College at Stevens Point in 1948-49.

He returned to the Tribune and was employed there until entering the Air Force Nov. 27, 1951. Assigned to the Air Intelligence Service, he attended the Army language school in Monterey, Calif. He was trained as a Russian interpreter and served in Alaska for a year. Johnson was discharged in September, 1955, and enrolled at the University of Wisconsin. His marriage to the former Barbara Shaut, Waupun, took place in April this year. They will reside at Hartl Manor.
