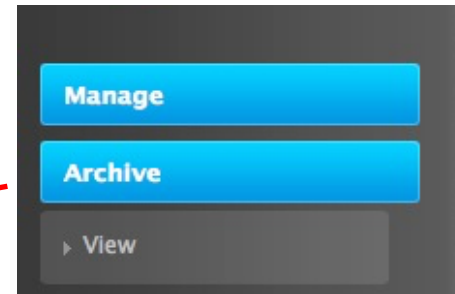


# Accessing Archive

By default, the most recent edition that you have uploaded to the WNA archive will be visible first. The black top menu needs to be "pinned" to stay or it will disappear. It shows the Page, section, edition date. No need to change the newspaper name (by default that is correct).

**Browse:** You can adjust how the Browse viewing mode behaves by adjusting the settings.

**Pages:** the current edition selected will display all edition pages to either download individual pages or entire edition. From the Pages Mode you can see small images of all pages in the edition you are viewing. This is an easy way to quickly scan through the entire publication. Click on any page image to open it for viewing. **This is where you can download pages/editions.**

**Index:** This is the default view of the e-Edition. It allows several options for formatting content for reading, printing or sharing. Clicking on an area of the page image displayed on the left side will load that content into the right side. Pressing the arrows on the right and left sides of the page image will change pages.

**Search Archive:** To view archived dates not in the pull down or do a search, select the "Search Archive" button.

**Fit:** Fits page to screen

## Pages:

After you have selected the edition you want – from here, you can download individual pages, sections, or the entire edition. Select the box next to the pages you want and then a black pop-up window will appear to “download selected pages” to your computer.

To download section or entire edition – select “download section” or “download entire edition” – it will take a few seconds to generate a PDF for download. Then click on the link to download the file – keep in mind it will be several MBs in size when downloading. And depending on your internet speed – could take time.
